## SERP-P Conducts Roadshow



To increase awareness of the benefits of SERP-P as a knowledge intermediation and brokering tool and to invite more research institutions to join the SERP-P Network, the SERP-P team conducted a road show from March to June 2013. Presentations were given to key officials and staff of the Department of Foreign Affairs-Foreign Service Institute (DFA-FSI) on April 15; SEAMEO

Regional Center for Educational Innovation and Technology (SEAMEO-INNOTECH) on April 17; Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and National Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD) on May 9; and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) on May 14. Several weeks after the briefing, SEAMEO-INNOTECH signed the memorandum of agreement (MOA) that formalizes its membership in the SERP-P Network and puts the total membership at 53 as of June 2013. The SEAMEO Center will soon be contributing its studies into the SERP-P database. The MOA signing with the DFA-FSI, PCAARD, and USAID are expected to take place within the year.

The SERP-P team also made a presentation at the World Bank Knowledge Development Center (KDC) Annual Meeting on April 29 to May 2 which was attended by all KDC representatives. Expressions of interest to join the SERP-P were received by the team from the KDCs, particularly the academic and research institutions based in the provinces.

A presentation on the SERP-P was also made by the team at the 18th Annual General Assembly and Symposium of the Philippine APEC Study Center Network (PASN) held on June 28 at Xavier University in Cagayan de Oro City. Out of the eight member-institutions of the PASCN, five of them or their mother institutions are already SERP-P members. The Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS), as the SERP-P's lead agency and developer, hopes that all PASCN member-institutions (all of which are leading research institutions in the country) are also members of the SERP-P given their huge potential to contribute to the knowledge network. The Mindanao State University and Xavier University already expressed their interest to join the SERP-P.

"SERP-P is not just a portal. It is a 'knowledge network,'" says Dr. Sheila V. Siar, director of the Research Information Staff of PIDS.

"SERP-P is an online knowledge resource of studies related to economic development and policymaking in the Philippines, the country's first and only electronic repository of policy research and information that capitalizes on research networking," Siar added.

Meanwhile, SERP-P Overall Coordinator Kristine Carla O. Oteyza briefed the PCAARRD personnel on the portal and its benefits for SERP-P's member institutions.

Aside from being free, membership in SERP-P provides institutions wider exposure for its studies and researches. With about 5,000 studies from 51 member-institutions, SERP-P also facilitates knowledge resource sharing and provides opportunity to interact and link with other SERP-P network members.

### Congressional Policy and Budget Research Department House of Representatives, Republic of the Philippines

One of the most active members of the SERP-P Network is the Congressional Policy and Budget Research Department (CPBRD). CPBRD only joined SERP-P in 2011 but it has been regularly uploading their publications into the SERP-P database, especially their Policy Briefs, and actively promoting the project to their technical staff.

Formerly known as the Congressional Planning and Budget Office or CPBO, CPBRD is part of the Secretariat of the House of Representatives. CPBRD's primary mandate is to provide data and analyses on the implications of various policies, issues, and other socioeconomic developments in the country. It has been at the forefront of proactive legislation and policy advocacy, working in close coordination with the various committees and offices of the House of Representatives.

CPBRD's current head is Dr. Romulo Emmanuel M. Miral, Jr., director general. Together with his team and representatives to the SERP-P project namely, Mr. Novel Bangsal and Tom Lagasca, Dr. Miral has constantly showed his strong support of the SERP-P project by making sure that coordination between the CPBRD and the SERP-P team at PIDS is running smoothly.

The CPBRD remains as a staunch supporter of the Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS) in advocating for evidence-based policymaking. Aside from their collaboration in the SERP-P, PIDS and CPBRD are partners in the [Electronic Resource Base for Legislation \(ERBL\)](#), an online knowledge resource that functions as a reservoir of information for the legislators and the public by linking legislation with available research studies.
